Rather than ask you to deal with them separately, we have compiled all the changes into one new proposal, ST-89. You can remove ST-88 from your consideration.

COMMITTEE ON UNIVERSITY STATUTES AND SENATE PROCEDURES (Final; Action)

SP.19.15/SP.23.01 Proposed Revision to the *Statutes*, Article IV, Section 1 – The Department, Section 2 – Department Organized with a Chair (Section 2b – Department Organized with a Chair), Section 3 – Department Organized with a Head (Section 3b – Department Organized with a Head), and Section 4 – Change of Department Administrative Organization

BACKGROUND

At its March 7, 2022 meeting, the Senate considered SP.19.15, a set of proposed revisions to sections of Article IV of the University *Statutes*. SP.19.15 was amended on the floor to remove a restriction that would have constrained the composition of department-level advisory committees, as this provision would have proved untenable for units with large portions of their faculty with appointments under 50%. The Committee on University *Statutes* and Senate Procedures noted at the time that it would continue to consider the issue.

The following proposed revisions (SP.23.01) would replace two passages in the *Statutes* with more generalized boundaries for departments regarding the compositions of executive and advisory committees, specifying what units should spell out in the *Bylaws*. This would make the two areas of Article IV (Sections 2b and 3b) more comparable, while allowing units to govern themselves appropriately given their actual compositions.

RECOMMENDATION

The Senate Committee on University Statutes and Senate Procedures recommends approval of the following revisions to the *Statutes*, Article IV, Sections 2b and 3b, amending proposed revisions contained in SP.19.15, approved by the Senate on March 7, 2022.

Text to be deleted is struck through and text to be added is underscored.

PROPOSED REVISION TO THE STATUTES, ARTICLE IV, SECTIONS 1-4

ARTICLE IV. DEPARTMENTS

)	Section	1. The	Department

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- a. Within the University of Illinois System, the department is the primary unit of education and
- 4 administration. It is established for the purpose of carrying on conducting programs of
- 5 instruction, research, and public service in a particular field of knowledge. The staff of a
- 6 department includes persons individuals of all ranks who, upon the recommendation of by its
- 7 chair or head or chair, are appointed or assigned to it. The faculty of a department shall be as
- 8 specified in Article II, Section 3a of these Statutes. All Any appointments which that carry carries
- 9 academic rank, title, or tenure indicative in any way of departmental association shall be made
- 10 only with the concurrence prior recommendation of by the department(s) concerned faculty.
- b. The department has the fullest measure of autonomy consistent with the maintenance of
- 12 general college and university educational policy and of correct academic and administrative
- relations with other divisions of the university. Should-If a dispute arises between the
- department and another unit of the university concerning the proper limits of this autonomy,
- 15 then the department may appeal for a ruling directly to the dean and the executive committee
- of the college and, when the chancellor/vice president considers it proper, to the
- 17 chancellor/vice president, who shall make a decision after appropriate consultation with
- interested parties.
- 19 c. A department may be organized either with a chair or with a head. A reorganization of the
- administration structure of a department from a chair to a head, or a head to a chair, may be
- accomplished only by Section 4 of this Article.

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Section 2. Department Organized with a Chair

- a. The chair shall be appointed annually by the Board of Trustees on recommendation of by the
- 25 chancellor/vice president, with the concurrence of the president, after confidential
- consultations with the dean of the college, and with the executive committee of the
- department, and the faculty of the department concerned. Prior to the initial appointment of a
- 28 <u>department chair, a committee that is selected by the faculty of the department, according to</u>
- 29 <u>its bylaws, shall advise the dean on the appointment.</u> The performance of the chair shall be

evaluated formally at least once every five years in a manner to be determined by department, school, or college bylaws. As one component of this evaluation, views shall be solicited from the entire department faculty in such a way as to preserve confidentiality. The chair may be relieved of title and duties as chair of the department by the chancellor/vice president on recommendations by the dean of the college and the executive committee of the department. Replace: d.b. In each department organized with a chair, there There shall be an executive committee elected annually by and from the faculty of the department by secret written ballot. At least one-half of the members of the departmental executive committee shall be elected from those faculty members who have at least a 50-percent salaried appointment in the Uuniversity of Illinois system. The faculty may choose to elect members of the executive committee for staggered two- or three-year terms. The chair of the department is ex officio a member and chair of the executive committee. The chair and the executive committee are responsible for the preparation of the budget and for such matters as may be delegated to them by the faculty of the department. In a department which that has a faculty of not more than five members, the executive committee shall consist of the entire faculty. In all other cases, the size of the executive committee shall be determined by the faculty of the

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b. There shall be an executive committee elected annually by secret written ballot, by and from the faculty of the department. Department bylaws may mandate a minimum percentage faculty appointment in the department for voting privileges. The faculty of the department shall, in its bylaws, determine the size, composition, and minimum percentage appointment in the department for members of the executive committee.

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The faculty may choose to elect members of the executive committee for staggered two- or three-year terms. A chair of the committee shall be chosen by and from elected members by secret written ballot. The chair of the department is an *ex officio* member of the executive committee. If the executive committee is in session to advise on the initial or annual

Any member of the executive committee may request the chair of the 66 67 committee to convene a meeting on any matter properly within its purview. Any faculty 68 member shall be entitled to a conference with the executive committee or with any member of 69 the committee on any matter properly within its purview. e(3) c. The chair shall collaborate with the executive committee in the preparation of to prepare 70 71 the departmental budget. The chair shall be responsible for the distribution and expenditure of 72 departmental funds for purposes approved by the executive committee, and for the care of 73 departmental property. 74 e. d. In each department organized with a chair, that officer The chair shall be responsible for 75 the formulation and execution of-departmental policies and for the execution of system, 76 university, and college policies, insofar as they affect the department. The chair shall have the 77 power to act independently in such matter as are delegated to the chair by the executive 78 committee. The chair and the executive committee are responsible for the organization and 79 general direction of the work of the department, and for the quality and efficient progress of 80 that work. The faculty may delegate to the chair other such matters for which the chair shall be 81 responsible. The executive committee may delegate to the chair such matters for which the 82 chair shall have the power to act independently. 83 The chair shall (1) report on the teaching and research of the department; (2) have general 84 oversight of the work of students in the department; (3) collaborate with the executive 85 committee in the preparation of the budget and be responsible for the expenditure of departmental funds for the purposes approved by the executive committee; and (4) call and 86 preside at meetings of the executive committee and at meetings of the department faculty of 87 88 which there shall be not fewer than one in each academic year for consideration of questions of 89 departmental governance and educational policy. 90 pertaining to it; (2) consult with the departmental executive committee in regard to 91 departmental policy; (3) consult with each member of the department regarding the nature and 92 scope of the work in the charge of that member; (4) report on the teaching and research of the 93 department; (5) have general oversight of the work of students in the department; and (6) call 94 and preside at meetings of the department faculty, for explanation and discussion of 95 departmental policies, educational procedure, and research, of which there shall be at least one in each academic year for consideration of questions of departmental governance and 96 97 educational policy. 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Section 3. Department Organized with a Head

a. The head of a department shall be appointed without specified term by the Board of Trustees on recommendation by the chancellor/vice president, with the concurrence of the president, after confidential consultations with the dean of the college, and all members the advisory committee of the department, and the faculty of the department-concerned. Prior to the initial

appointment of a department head, a committee that is selected by the faculty of the department, according to its bylaws, shall advise the dean on the appointment. The head may be relieved of title and duties as head of the department by the chancellor/vice president on the recommendation of the dean of the college. The performance of the head shall be reviewed annually and evaluated formally at least once every five years in a manner to be determined by department, school, or college bylaws. As one component of the formal evaluation, views shall be solicited from the entire department faculty in such a way as to preserve confidentiality. The head may be relieved of title and duties as head of the department by the chancellor/vice president on recommendations by the dean of the college and the advisory committee of the department.

f-b. In each department organized with a head, there-There shall be an advisory committee elected annually by and from the faculty of the department by secret written ballot. The department faculty may choose to elect members of the advisory committee for staggered two-or three-year terms In a department which that has a faculty of not more than five members, the advisory committee shall consist of the entire faculty. 151	committee or with any member of it on any matter properly within the purview of the
152	committee. A chair of the committee shall be chosen by and from elected members by secret
153	written ballot. The head of the department is an ex officio member of the advisory committee.
154	If the advisory committee is in session to advise on the initial appointment or the annual review
155	of the head of the department or to evaluate formally the head's performance, the head shall
156	not be a member and the committee shall be chaired by a committee member elected by the

158	The functions of the advisory committee shall be to provide for the orderly voicing of
159	suggestions for the good of the department, to recommend procedures and committees that
160	will encourage faculty participation in formulating policy, and to perform such other tasks as
161	may be assigned to it. Any member of the advisory committee may request the chair of the
162	committee to convene a meeting on any matter properly within its purview. Any faculty
163	member shall be entitled to a conference with the advisory committee or with any member of
164	the committee on any matter properly within its purview.
165	d(7, 8) c. The head shall consult with the advisory committee to prepare the departmental
166	budget in consultation with the departmental advisory committee. The head shall be
167	responsible for the distribution and expenditure of departmental funds, in accordance with the
168	general purposes established by the advisory committee, and for the care of departmental
169	property.
170	d. In each department organized with a head, the head shall have general direction of the work
171	of the department. The head shall be responsible for the formulation and execution of
172	department policies and for the execution of system, university, and college policies, insofar as
173	they affect the department. The head, in consultation with the faculty, is responsible for the
174	organization and general direction of the work of the department, and for the quality and
175	efficient progress of that work. The faculty may delegate to the head other such matters for
176	which the head shall be responsible. The advisory committee may delegate to the head such
177	matters for which the head shall have the power to act independently.
178	The head shall (1) represent the department in all matters pertaining to it; (12) consult with the
179	departmental advisory committee in regard to departmental policy; (23) consult with each

member of the department regarding the nature and scope of the work in the charge of that member; (3) call and preside at meetings of the departmental faculty for explanation and discussion of departmental policies, educational procedure, and research, of which there shall be at least one in each academic year for consideration of departmental governance and educational policy; (4) be responsible for the organization of the work of the department, for the quality and efficient progress of that work, for the formulation and execution of departmental policies, and for the execution of University and college policies insofar as they affect the department; (5)(4) report on the teaching and research of the department; (6)(5) have general oversight of the work of students in the department; and (6) call and preside at meetings of the departmental faculty, for explanation and discussion of departmental policies, educational procedure, and research, of which there shall be at least one in each academic year for consideration of departmental governance and educational policy. (7) prepare the departmental budget in consultation with the departmental advisory committee; and (8) be responsible for the distribution and expenditure of departmental funds and for the care of departmental property. e. In the administration of the office, the The head shall recognize the individual responsibility of other each members of the department for the discharge of the duties committed to them by their appointments and shall allow proper scope to the ability and initiative of all each members of the department. b. f. In each department organized with a head, the The head in consultation with the advisory committee shall recommend individuals for academic appointment in the department. In consultation with the advisory committee, or as specified in the department bylaws, the head may invite other persons individuals who are not members of the department faculty may be invited by the chair to attend meetings of the department faculty, but such persons individuals shall have no vote. c.g. The head's of the department shall have the power to determine such matters as authority is limited to matters that do not affect other departments or properly come under the supervision of larger higher administrative units.

Section 4. Change of Departmental Administrative Organization

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Prior to the initial appointment of a department chair or department head, or On the
written request of at least one-fourth of the faculty of the department, as defined in Article II,
Section 3a(1), and in no case fewer than two faculty members, that the form of the
administrative organization of the department be changed from a chair to a head, or a head to
a-chair, the dean shall call a meeting to poll the departmental faculty by secret written ballot
whether the form of the administrative organization of the department should be changed
from a chair to a head or from a head to a chair. The names of those making the request shall
be kept confidential $\frac{1}{2}$ by the dean. The dean shall transmit the results of the vote $\frac{1}{2}$ approve or
disapprove a change, along with the dean's own recommendation, to the departmental faculty
and to the chancellor/vice president together with the dean's recommendation. If a change of
<u>administrative</u> organization is voted <u>approved by the departmental faculty</u> , the chancellor/vice
president shall thereupon further transmit this the results of the vote of the faculty along with
the recommendations of \underline{by} the dean and of the chancellor/vice president to the $\underline{departmental}$
faculty and to the president for recommendation to the Board of Trustees. Faculty of the
department may communicate with the Board of Trustees with regard to the vote to change
the administrative organization of the department, in accordance with Article XIII, Section 4 <u>d</u> of
these <i>Statutes</i> .

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
